“Understanding the Experiences of Women in Irish Traditional Music” #ISWÜ

This talk documents the experiences of women performing in Irish traditional music. Drawing on extensive ethnographic research and statistical studies from my forthcoming monograph and PhD research, I discuss how and in what way expectations differ according to an Irish traditional performer's identified gender. I reflect on my experience as a researcher, musician, and activist with the volunteer grassroots organisation, FairPlé, and demonstrate the challenges and prejudices impacting the participation of women in today's Irish traditional music and dance scene, and commercial music industry. I conclude by emphasising the importance of action-based research projects that actively benefit the community that is being studied.

This talk addresses the important topic of women and Irish traditional music. Drawing on my forthcoming monograph and PhD research conducted over five years, I discuss key findings pertaining to the experiences of women performing on the recreational and commercial platforms of Irish traditional music and dance. Through the lens of applied ethnomusicology, I interrogate the complexities of my positionality as a researcher, musician, and feminist activist with the volunteer grassroots organisation, FairPlé, and examine the impact this has had on my overall research project. I conclude by discussing the need for further studies that are shaped, informed by, and conducted with the goal of benefiting the people of the research.
